In this tutorial I will show you how to create the focus on individual items on a photo.


# **Final Image Preview**



# **Step 1**Click and copy the image from the Phototeacher site. Open a new document in Photoshop. Edit -> Paste


#### Step 2


Get out the Elliptical Marquee Tool and create selection similar to the selection on my picture below.





Step 3
Blur selection borders about 50 pixel.
Go to Select > Modify > change to 50 px






## Step 3

Invert selection with Ctrl+Shift+I OR go to Select > Inverse

**Step 4**Go to Filter > Blur > Gaussian Blur with similar settings to these:






### Step 5

We know that the focus should be gradual, so we should slightly increase the area of selection and blur long field more.


Go to Select > Inverse

**Step 5-1**The go to Select > Modify > Expand





Note the selected area is bigger now



**Step 6-1**Go to Select > Inverse

**Step 6-2** 

Go to Filter > Blur > Gaussian Blur with next presets:



#### Step 7


We are done with creating focus on the photo.

We will add one last effect that will draw more attention to the subject of the image.

Go to Edit > Copy

Then, Edit > Paste.


You should have a new layer with the selected part of the image copied to it.



Step 8:

Go to Image > Adjustments > Hue/Saturation

Turn the Saturation slider all the way to the left.



Congrats, you are done! Save as a jpg and post to weebly.

Choose 2 of your own photographs, and apply the same process. Post those on weebly as well.
