
Step 1:

Step 6:


In the Actions toolbox, click on New Action.


Step 7:

Press Record








Step 9: Go to Image > Image Size




Enter in the dimensions:

Step 11:


Go to File > Save Go to File > Close


Step 12:

Go to File > Automate > Batch






Step 14:

Step 15:


Open up Adobe Bridge

Click and drag across so that all of the pictures are selected.





Step 17:

Go to Image > Canvas Size...






Step 19:

Change Width: 11 Inches

Height: 8.5 Inches

Step 20:

Use the Move tool to arrange the layers.

Make sure "Auto Select" is checked.




Step 21:

Choose the crop tool to change the size of the document.




Step 22:

Step 23:


Choose the Paint bucket tool. (you might have to click and hold to get the Paintbucket tool)
